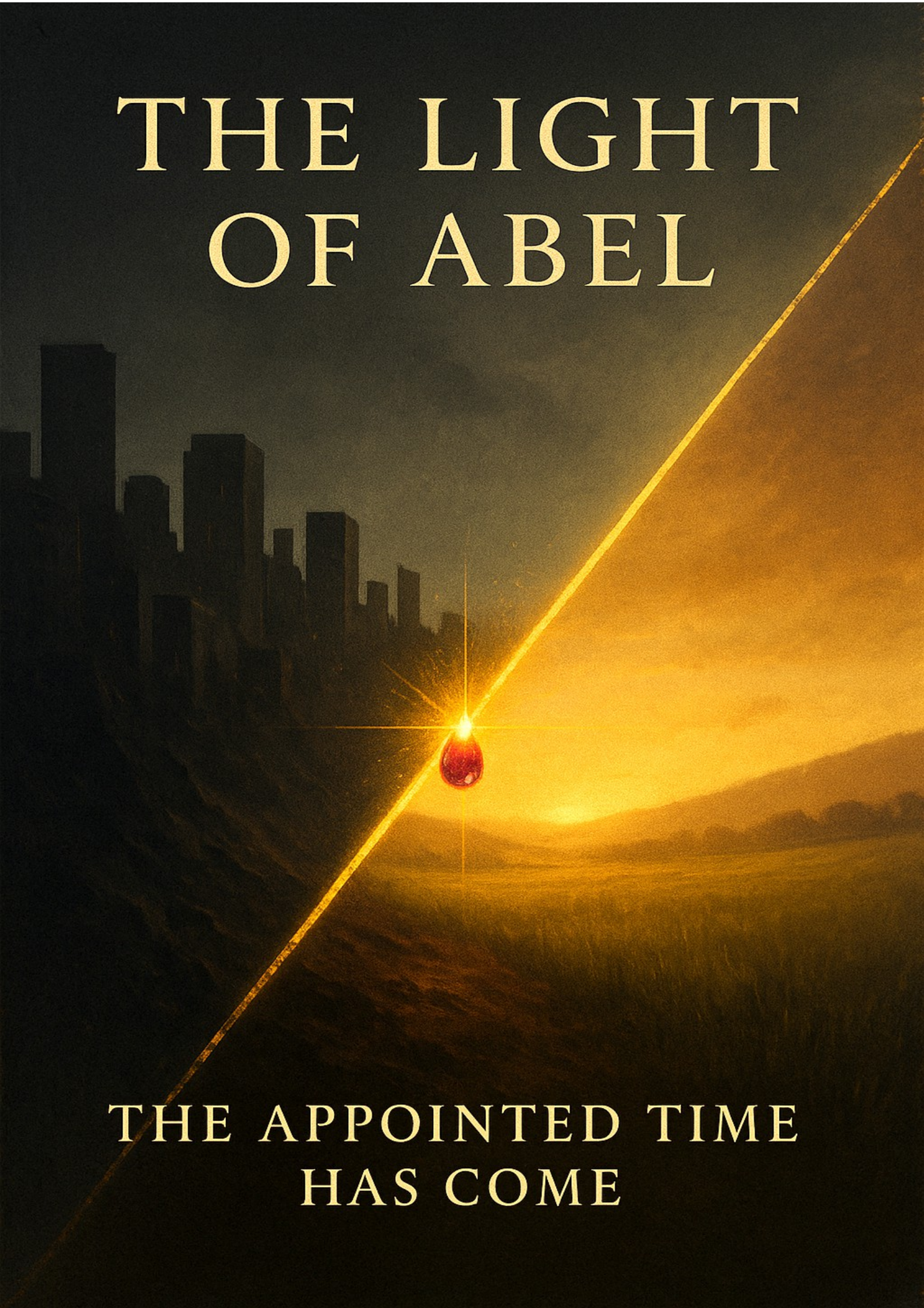

Creation itself testifies: Abel was innocent.

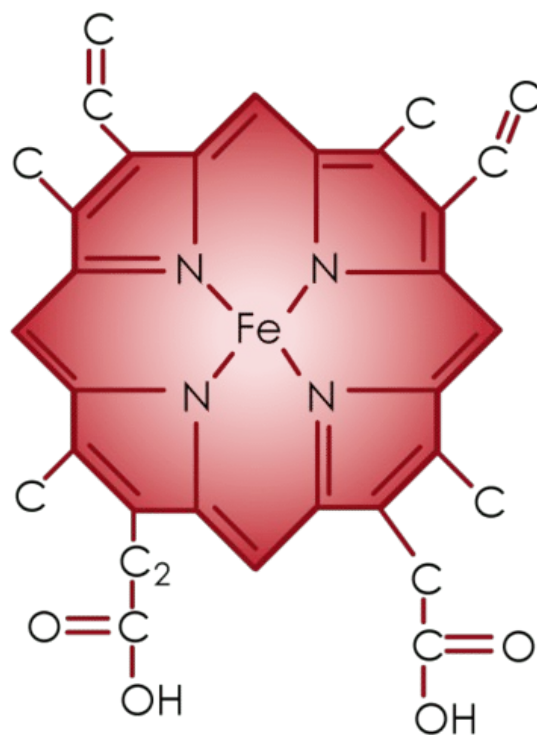

The molecule has spoken.

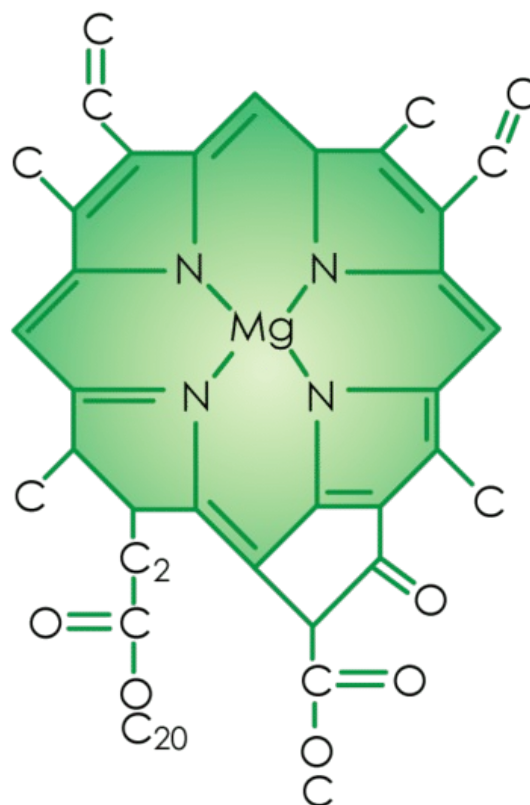
